ITINERARY

DAY 1-3 | 12, 13 and 14 May: The Southwest of the Okavango Delta

Our photography safari begins in the spectacular southwest of the Okavango Delta. There is nowhere in Africa more beautiful or photogenic than the Okavango Delta in its first flood, as the vast Kalahari sands turn into a wetland paradise with scatterings of waterlilies throughout the floodplains. The animals that have migrated in the green season will all start to make their way back to this watery paradise.

Meeting at Maun Airport, we'll take a short flight to reach the Kanana Lodge. A hidden jewel on the Xudum River, Kanana rests in a necklace of islands dotted with palms, figs, ebony and knobthorn, and is home to a myriad of native African animals, birds and plants. The nature of the habitat means it is the perfect place to photograph the diversity of species found within the Okavango Delta.

As we're travelling during the "miracle season" you'll have the privilege of shooting the annual transformation of the Delta's floodplains. Presenting you with the diversity of both picture-perfect wetlands and grasslands. At this time of year, you can expect clear blue skies, rising floodwaters, and an abundance of wildlife.

Over three days we'll embark on sunrise, morning, afternoon, evening and night photography safaris by 4x4 and boat. Should you wish, you can also explore the area by Mekoro. The Mekoro is a dugout canoe poled by an experienced poler in the shallower waters of the Okavango.

Reminiscent of the romantic safaris of the 1920s, your luxury tent is decorated in a classic safari style incorporating the land and water of the Okavango Delta in the experience. Your stay will be luxurious, comfortable and unforgettable.

DAY 4-6 | 15, 16 and 17 May: A Northern Okavango Delta Eden

On the second leg of our adventure, we journey to the breathtaking northern Okavango Delta – the closest thing to Eden left on the planet. Champagne-coloured rivers, palm-fringed waterways and lily-covered lagoons represent one of the largest wetland wildernesses in the world – a place where classic African wildlife thrives, and the photography experience is second-to-none.

After a short flight from the south to the north of the Delta, you'll be welcomed at the Shinde Camp. Nestled on a lush palm island in the heart of the northern Okavango Delta, Shinde is an intimate, classic camp that rests on a lagoon which simply teems with animal and birdlife.

As a private concession park, you'll enjoy an exclusive photography experience. Here we have the freedom to travel off-road, embark on night-drives, and the Shinde is one of the few lodges that offer walking safaris in the Okavango Delta – accompanied by expertly trained and armed guides of course.

Prepare yourself for phenomenal wildlife population, scenic landscapes, and countless moments of inspiration that will leave you with images in the hundreds.

The Shinde Camp provides a sense of exclusive luxury with only eight luxury tents and promises your every possible comfort will be catered for.

ITINERARY CONTINUED

DAY 7-9 | 18, 19 and 20 May: The Moremi Game Reserve

You're about to spend three unforgettable days in the heart of the world-renowned Moremi Game Reserve.

The Moremi Game Reserve proudly boasts some of Africa's densest concentration of wildlife. Home to the Big Five (lions, leopards, buffaloes, elephants and rhinos), one of Africa's largest population of red lechwe, and so much more, you'll feel as if you've stepped into a wildlife photographer's paradise.

Our basecamp in the Moremi will be the private Okuti Lodge, which sits amidst the wilderness of one of Botswana's prime game viewing regions. Making it the ideal location from which to enjoy multiple photography safari's in specially designed vehicles.

While Moremi is celebrated for its big predators, we'll also go in search of Africa's smaller predators in residence including cheetah, spotted hyena, jackals, and wild dog, while the herbivore cast features giraffe, wildebeest, zebra, and an assortment of antelopes.

Awarded five-star status by the Botswana Tourism Board, Okuti is a delightful camp of spacious curved mosasas (ancient tribal word for house of reeds). Drawing its influence from the water that flows in front of the camp, Okuti will offer you an oasis of serenity and peacefulness between safaris.

DAY 10-13 | 21, 22, 23 and 24 May: The Iconic Chobe National Park and Victoria Falls

We mark the final stage of our photography safari in the one-and-only Chobe National Park. Let's be honest, you can't visit Botswana without shooting Chobe, which is not only famous for its elephants but is also recognised as one of the world's leading wildlife destinations.

After a short flight to the Kasane Airport, we'll arrive at the Machenje Safari Lodge, resting in the heart of the Chobe Forest Reserve. Machenje will spoil you with picturesque views and private photography safari tours of the Chobe River, which provides a permanent source of water for the region's high volume of wildlife, making the river an important focal point for our safari and wildlife photography.

Our tour will take us into the quieter (in terms of crowds) western region of Chobe National Park, renowned for its huge concentrations of elephant, hippo, Cape buffalo, lions, leopards, wild dogs, hyena, jackals, serval cats, caracal (lynx), honey badgers and crocodiles. The park's abundant plains are also home to giraffe, sable antelope, roan antelope, kudu, waterbuck, red lechwe, impala, puku, Chobe bushbuck, tsessebe, eland, duiker, warthog, steenbok and dazzles of zebra.

On one day we'll venture across the border to photograph the spectacle that is Victoria Falls. Truly a natural wonder of the world, Victoria Falls promises to be an unforgettable experience.

The Muchenje Safari Lodge itself one of Chobe's oldest and most established luxury safari lodges and you'll fall in love with your private cottage with its own private deck and vista across the Chobe River.

DAY 14 | 25 May: Journey home

Preparing for our fond farewell, we travel by plane to Maun Airport. From here, you begin your journey home.

Level of photography



CHECKLIST

Camera equipment

- DSLR. To bring a couple of bodies is always recommended. (check your baggage allowance with your airline/travel agent)
- Tripod with quick release plate
- Standard zoom, wide angle and telephoto lens
- Plenty of batteries and a couple of chargers
- Shutter cable release
- Polarising filter and ND filters
- Laptop computer with Photoshop and Lightroom and/or Capture One
- External backup drives (SSD recommended) and memory cards for storage
- As a Nikon photographer, Ignacio plans to bring two bodies and lenses that cover the range of 24mm to 400mm plus a x1.4 teleconverter, a 24-70mm f2.8 70-200mm f2.8 and possibly a 180-400 f4 and a 400mm f2.8 prime.

What to bring, clothing and other

- Water bottle (1lt) to avoid the use of plastic bottles for mineral water. Our guide will make sure to refill your bottle whenever necessary.
- Sun block and sun glasses (protection against UV)
- Hat
- The temperatures in May are relatively mild reaching on the rare occasion 10°C/50°F in the morning and up to 28°C/80°F in the afternoon
- We recommend comfortable clothing made of fabric that breaths (such as cotton) and pack a combination of short sleeve and long sleeve top and pant options
- Comfortable hiking boots
- And you may wish to bring swimwear to take advantage of the pools in our lodges.

Luggage preparations


- Additional luggage allowances have been arranged across all of your internal flights for your convenience
- We recommend you shrink-wrapping your baggage at your departure airport
- Ensure your telephoto lenses are packing in protective casings designed for this specific lens
- We also suggest you carry your camera equipment as carry-on luggage where possible in the event your luggage is delayed or lost, you can still shoot the moment you arrive.

WORKSHOP DATES AND PRICES

Tour dates: **12 – 25 May 2022**

Tour commences and finishes as Maun Airport, Botswana

Standard trip: **US\$18,697** per person, twin share;
Optional single supplement: **US\$4,990**

Maximum 8-10 participants

A deposit of **US\$3,000** is required when you book the workshop

Terms of payment

- A deposit of US\$3,000 must be paid to secure your place. The deposit is non-refundable unless you can sell your place to someone else
- Note: the workshop is quoted in US\$. To calculate the rate in AU\$, the currency exchange rate will be obtained from the Westpac website at the time of transferring the deposit and balance (<https://www.westpac.com.au/personal-banking/services/currency-converter/>). If you are located outside Australia, I accept payments in US\$ through PayPal only
- The Registration Form must be filled in and signed by each participant at the time of paying the first deposit. Participation will be declined otherwise
- The remaining balance must be paid on or before **30 January 2022**
- Bookings will be accepted strictly in the order they are received
- Important: the workshop requires a minimum of 6 participants to run so please don't book your flights until the trip has been confirmed.

What's included

- Full 14 day and 13 night tour
- All meals and accommodation
- All excursions
- English speaking guide
- Park and reserve fees
- Internal flights and transfers
- Local taxes.

What's not included

- Flights to and from Maun Airport
- Accommodation and meals prior to or following the expedition
- Travel, cancellation and equipment insurances
- Visas
- Alcohol consumption, extra beverages or souvenirs
- Laundry services
- Other personal expenses
- Tips and gratuities.

Note on tips: gratuities for local guides, hotel staff, butlers etc. are not included on this tour. However, if you feel that any staff has given you exceptional service, it is entirely appropriate to tip them. We emphasize that such tips should be at your own discretion and based solely on the level of your service satisfaction.

Cancellation Policy

A written notice of any cancellation must be received by you at which time the following cancellation fees will apply:

- If cancelled between 1 November 2021 and 31 December 2021, 50% of the workshop cost will be payable
- If cancelled after 1 January 2022, a fee equal to 100% of the workshop cost will be payable
- Failure to pay by the due dates will be considered a cancellation of the booking and fees paid will be non-refundable

- Bookings made after 1 November 2021 must be paid in full
- No refunds will be made for unused portions of the workshop. The photography workshop is sold as a land package (no airfares included)
- Cancellation fees are not transferable.

Camera gear

There is really no limit to what camera gear you take. Check with your airline about weight restrictions. Whatever level of camera equipment you have, we will help to ensure you get the most out of it. Check the camera equipment checklist at the end of the brochure but if you want to discuss specific equipment for this trip, please contact me.

Fitness and health considerations

Sometimes participants will be required to walk on uneven terrain or tracks and hiking. A basic level of walking fitness will help, but this tour is not a hiking tour or a trekking tour so nothing extreme will be required. If you have concerns about your own capabilities or health, please check with your doctor before booking a place. By signing the Registration Form, you guarantee that to the best of your knowledge, you do not have any physical or other disability that could create a risk for you or other tour participants. Once a booking has been accepted by IP Travel Photography, medical circumstances will not be

accepted as an exemption to the Cancellation Policy above.

Within the Registration Form, please indicate any health issues, allergies or dietary requirements. IP Travel Photography does not assume any responsibility or liability for medical care or special dietary requirements. that we will attempt to stick as close to the original program as possible




