At night, both the Atacama and the Altiplano are amazing locations to do some astrophotography, as the air quality is just superb. At this time of the year it could be filled with water completely, or in some areas only, which will also give us an opportunity to photograph its famous hexagons.

ALTIPLANO




A landscape of ice and fire, the Altiplano is a place of superlatives. It is where the South American Andes are at their widest and it is the most extensive area of high plateau on Earth outside of Tibet. It also holds the world's highest navigable lake, Titicaca, and the largest salt flat, Salar de Uyuni.

ATACAMA DESERT

The Atacama Desert is without a doubt one of the most stunning regions we have ever been to, anywhere in the world. It is the driest and the oldest desert on earth, and has experienced extreme hyperaridity for at least 3 million years, making it the oldest continuously arid region on earth.

DESERT LANDSCAPE

“Much of the Atacama Desert resembles planet Mars – and not just the looks but the conditions as well. Water is extremely scarce and much of the desert is inhospitable – not even bacteria can survive in some areas! For this reason, NASA actually uses the Atacama Desert to prepare missions to Mars...”



The breathtaking desert landscape that we will explore in our tour is the result of centuries of winds and floods on the sand and stone of the region.

In the Atacama, the large sand dunes of Valle de la Luna and the stone formations mimic the surface of the moon, giving the region its name, which translates to “Valley of the Moon”. The unique color of the landscape, caused by the way the salt formations reflect the sunlight, makes the Valle de la Luna a beautiful, changing spectrum of bright blue, green, yellow and red colors.

Licancabur volcano is an active stratovolcano that can be seen from San Pedro and along the route to Uyuni. Licancabur has an impressive symmetric shape with constant 30 degrees slopes that we will be able to photograph from many different places, from both in Chile and Bolivia.

El Salar de Uyuni is an incredible place. It’s the world’s largest salt flat at an elevation of 3656 meters. DAY 1 | 11 FEBRUARY

Arrival in Calama airport and transfer to hotel

San Pedro de Atacama. Transfers from Calama airport to San Pedro. 5-star hotel, all inclusive – Tierra Atacama, Alto Atacama or similar 5-star hotel.

DAY 2 TO 6 | 12-16 FEBRUARY

San Pedro de Atacama, Atacama Desert (5 full days)

We will do day and/or half day tours (sunrise, sunset and full day tours) around the Atacama Desert. Sunrise and sunset locations will be determined based on time and the weather forecast. These might include:

- Moon Valley: The Dead Valley (Cordillera de la Sal) and The Amphitheatre
- El Tatio Geysers (sunrise shot)
- Rainbow Valley
- Laguna Cejar and Piedra, Tebinquiche Lagoon (sunset)
- Lagunas Altiplanicas (Meñique and Miscanti), Atacama Salar, Chaxa Lagoon and Toconao village
- Piedras Rojas/Salar de Tara.

Hotel Tierra Atacama, Alto Atacama or similar 5-star hotel.

DAY 7 | 17 FEBRUARY

Border crossing and lagoons

Hotel check-out. Border crossing to Bolivia. We will stop at some incredible lakes including White Lagoon, at 4700m, Green Lagoon, and Laguna Colorada with its spectacular red color and its flamingo colonies and geysers. We will also visit Dali's Valley, Chalviry Lagoon, the Sun Morning Geysers and we will have a relaxing bath in Polques Hot Springs. Sunset shots at Red Lagoon. Refugio Huayllajara/Laguna Colorada.

DAY 8 | 18 FEBRUARY

Red Lagoon and Siloli Desert

Sunrise at Red Lagoon, then driving to Stone Tree, Siloli Desert, and "Colorful Mountain". Sunset at Siloli Desert. Hotel Ojito de Perdiz.

DAY 9-10 | 19-20 FEBRUARY

Fisher Island, Uyuni

Visiting Charcota Lagoon, Deep Lagoon (Laguna Honda), Stinky Lagoon, Canapa Lagoon, Volcano Ollague lookout, Chiguana Salt Plain and Incahuasi Island (or Fisher Island) in Uyuni Salt Lake. Sunset at Uyuni Salt Lake. Staying at Salt Hotel.

ITINERARY CONTINUED

DAY 11 | 21 FEBRUARY

Uyuni Salt Lake and border crossing to Chile

Uyuni Salt Lake sunrise. Then visiting Stone Valley train cemetery, Villa Mar town, and border crossing to Chile. Hotel Tierra Atacama, Alto Atacama or similar 5-star hotel.

DAY 12 | 22 FEBRUARY

San Pedro de Atacama – Atacama Desert

We will have plenty of photographs from the tour. You have the option to go out again to the Atacama Desert, or to spend the whole day doing some post-processing whilst relaxing at the hotel. Hotel Tierra Atacama Alto Atacama or similar 5-star hotel.

DAY 13 | 23 FEBRUARY

San Pedro – Calama – End of Tour

One more sunrise shot for those with time and energy. The tour ends after breakfast at the hotel. Transfers to Calama airport, if required.

“El Tatio is one of the most impressive thermal areas of the Andes. Situated at 4,320 meters above the sea level, it is among the highest-elevation geyser fields in the world. Its name comes from the Quechua word for oven.”

Camera equipment

- DSLR or Medium Format (check your baggage allowance with your airline/travel agent)
- Tripod with quick release plate
- Standard zoom, wide angle and telephoto lenses
- Battery and chargers
- Shutter cable release
- Polarising filter and ND filters
- Laptop computer with Photoshop and Lightroom and/or Capture One
- External backup drives and memory cards for storage.

We recommend to shrink-wrap your baggage at your departure airport. Ensure your telephoto lenses are packed in protective packs designed for such lenses. We also recommend that you pack your camera equipment as your hand luggage as much as possible so that if the checked-in baggage is lost or delayed at least you can start photographing as soon as you arrive.

Note: Please contact me if you want to discuss equipment for this trip.

What to bring, clothing and other

- Hiking boots (well-worn in)
- Hiking poles
- Water bottle or camel pack
- Sunglasses (mandatory to walk near/on glaciers)
- Hat, gloves (thin and thick), sunscreen, insect repellent

- Wind jacket and jumper
- Head torch
- Alarm clock.

Participants will be required to walk on uneven terrain or tracks and hiking. A basic level of walking fitness will help, but this tour is not a hiking tour or a trekking tour so nothing extreme will be required. If you have concerns about your own capabilities or health please check with your doctor before booking a place.

By signing the Registration Form, you guarantee that to the best of your knowledge, you do not have any physical or other disability that could create a risk for you or other tour participants. Once a booking has been accepted by IP Travel Photography, medical circumstances will not be accepted as an exemption to the Cancellation Policy above.
