UGANDA

Bwindi Impenetrable National Park is located in the southwestern part of Uganda on the rim of the Rift Valley. The hillsides which are mist-covered are sheltered by one of the ancient and very biologically varied rainforests in Uganda that dates back to more than 25,000 years, comprising of about 400 varied plant species.

More notably, this "impenetrable forest" protects a population of about 320 mountain gorillas – approximately half of the population in the world, among which are a number of habituated groups, that can be tracked by visitors. Bwindi is habitat to more than half the world's population of Mountain Gorillas.

In terms of vegetation and trekking experience, Mgahinga National Park Mountain gorillas are in the Virungas with mainly bamboo as the main vegetation, while in Bwindi, these gorillas are in a thick impenetrable tropical rain forest with varieties of trees and plants. In Mgahinga, gorillas are easier to access and see because of the kind of vegetation, making it easier to take clear photographs compared to other Parks. However, this park only has one family and only 8 permits are available each day compared to the 152 gorilla permits that are available for gorilla trekking in Bwindi.

Successful conservation efforts have saved these animals from the brink of extinction. Not only will we get to experience these efforts first-hand, but we too will become a part of it through photographing these animals. Our presence here will truly help the preservation of these Gorillas.

Trekking

We will reach the Gorillas on-foot by trekking to their mid-morning resting and feeding locations while being led by experienced guides and accompanied by park staff/guards employed to protect the gorillas.

When we find the Gorillas, all the hiking is worth it. You never know what unique behavior you will get to photograph until you reach them.

They may be feeding on bamboo shoots, lounging on thick beds made of vegetation, or playing with one another in an open clearing, forest, or in a dense bamboo thicket. There is no way to describe sitting and photographing a family of mountain gorillas. Time truly stops.

ITINERARY

DAY 1 | Thursday 11 July: Arrival and transfer to Bwindi Impenetrable National Park southern sector (Rushaga gate)

On your arrival at Entebbe Airport, you will meet your driver/guide who will take you through the program for the Safari and you will proceed to Bwindi Impenetrable National Park. Stopover for lunch and after lunch you will proceed to Rushaga. Welcome presentation and dinner.

Overnight at Nkuringo Bwindi Gorilla Lodge.

DAY 2 | Friday 12 July: Gorilla habituation experience at Bwindi Impenetrable National Park – 4 hrs. experience

6am breakfast, 7am brief where we will be assigned to visit a specific gorilla family. 8:30am–1pm gorilla trekking. We will spend exactly one hour with the gorillas upon arrival. Lunch followed by rest, freshen up, download, and image processing and review with Ignacio. 6:30pm dinner.

There is no known actual definition of the Gorilla Habituation Experience. However, it can simply be known as the act of training wild gorillas to become used to the sight of people. It involves different groups of people like the trackers, conservationists, trackers, researchers and rangers among others who take a period of about 2 to 3 years completing this habituation experience. It is a learning experience that has just recently become a stable activity presented by the Uganda Wildlife Authority on a small scale. This experience only restricts the persons to a maximum of 4 each day, thus bookings for this kind of activity are to be done 6 months prior to the actual habituation day specifically during the months of December all through to March and July to October.

Unlike Gorilla trekking that limits ones interaction with the gorillas to only an hour, Gorilla Habituation allows a person 4 hours in the company of the gorillas.

Overnight at Mount Gahinga Lodge.

DAY 3 | Saturday 13 July: Gorilla tracking experience at Mgahinga Gorilla National Park - 1 hr. experience


6am breakfast, 7am brief by the ranger. 8:30am-4pm gorilla trekking (approximately). We will spend exactly four hours with the gorillas upon arrival. Lunch followed by rest, freshen up, download, and image review with Ignacio. 7 pm dinner.

Today, you will have an early breakfast, packed lunch and we will drive shortly to the park gate where you will meet a team of rangers/guides for briefing and later take you for Gorilla tracking.

Overnight at Birdnest Resort.

DAY 4 | Sunday 14 July: Transfer to entebbe international airport

Early breakfast and drive to Entebbe Airport, you will have a stopover at the Equator along the way for lunch and then continue for your flight back home.

Level of photography

All skills levels are welcome. As for equipment, we can help you optimise the equipment you chose to use from mobile phone to tablets, compact camera to digital SLR cameras.

Physical considerations

The hike to the gorillas can sometimes be as short as thirty minutes to 1hr, but often requires a 'trek' of one or two hours one-way on uneven terrain through the jungle. Covering these distances can be difficult, the terrain is intermittently steep, and often slippery. When you combine that with the uphill elevation gain required to meet these animals, it can be quite tasking. We do not recommend this trip to anyone who isn't both fit and prepared to train beforehand. You should show up in their best shape. Most treks involve a vertical gain of 800 to 1,000 feet over a one or two-hour period. Expect to be at 8,500 feet, or higher, while photographing the Gorillas.

Camera equipment

- DSLR. To bring a couple of bodies is always recommended (check your baggage allowance with your airline/travel agent)
- Tripod with quick release plate
- Standard zoom, wide angle and telephoto lens
- Plenty of batteries and a couple of chargers
- Shutter cable release
- Polarising filter and ND filters
- Laptop computer with Photoshop and Lightroom and/or Capture One. Please make sure that these programs are working properly on your laptop before you arrive.
- External backup drives (SSD recommended) and memory cards for storage
- Lenses that cover the range of 24mm to 400mm plus, perhaps, a x1.4 teleconverter.
 I am planning to bring the following lenses: 24-70mm f2.8, 70-200mm f2.8 and possibly a 180-400 f4 or a 400mm f2.8 prime.

What to bring, clothing and other


- Water bottle (1lt) to avoid the use of plastic bottles for mineral water. Our guide will make sure to refill your bottle whenever necessary.
- Sun block and sun glasses (protection against UV)
- Hat
- We recommend comfortable clothing made of fabric that breaths (such as cotton) and pack a combination of short sleeve and long sleeve top and pant options
- · Comfortable hiking boots.
- Travel and medical insurance, passport, visa, medication that might include malaria pills

Luggage preparations

- Additional luggage allowances have been arranged across all of your internal flights for your convenience
- We recommend you shrinkwrap your baggage at your departure airport
- Ensure your telephoto lenses are packed in protective casings designed for this specific lens
- We also suggest you carry your camera equipment as carry-on luggage where possible. In the event your luggage is delayed or lost, you can still shoot the moment you arrive.

WORKSHOP DATES AND PRICES

Tour dates: 11 - 14 July 2024

The tour commences at Entebbe Airport (near Kampala), Uganda

Standard cost: **US\$8,990** per person; Optional single supplement: **US\$1,990**

Maximum 6 participants

A deposit of **US\$2,000** is required when you book the workshop

Terms of payment

- A deposit of US\$2,000 must be paid to secure your place.
 The deposit is non-refundable unless you can sell your place to someone else
- Note: the workshop is quoted in USD\$. To calculate the rate in AUD\$, the currency exchange rate will be obtained from the Westpac website at the time of transferring the deposit and balance
- The online Registration Form must be filled in and signed by each participant at the time of paying the first deposit Participation will be declined otherwise
- The remaining balance must be paid on or before
 March 2024
- Bookings will be accepted strictly in the order they are received
- Important: the workshop requires a minimum of 4 participants to run so please don't book your flights until the trip has been confirmed.

What's included

- Full 4 day/3-night tour, photography instruction by Ignacio Palacios

Cancellation Policy

A written notice of any cancellation must be received by you at which time the following cancellation fees will apply:

- If cancelled between 1 January 2024 and 28 February 2024, 60% of the workshop cost will be payable
